(Three Fingered Jack) White, notorious police character and once under a life imprisonment sentence for the murder of a policeman, thought he was a free man yesterday as he stepped from the front door of the new county jail, after more than three years' imprisonment. However, he did not reckon with Capt. William Schoemaker of the detective bureau, who was on hand to greet him.  
"Well, well! Look who's out!" said the captain. "I thought we had locked you up and thrown away the key, but it seems that we were mistaken. I'll just cart you down to our jail, where I think we have some old warrants for you."
